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### Lymphocytic Pleocytosis Manual Guide

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The CSF shows a lymphocytic pleocytosis with an average cell count around 200 cells/μL, increased protein contents (around 200 mg/dL) and low glucose levels (Table 100.3). In 20–25% of non-HIV infected patients neutrophilic predominance is present, that usually shifts to lymphocytic predominance over the next 24–48 hours (Verdon et al., 1996).

Lymphocytic pleocytosis is an abnormal increase in the amount of lymphocytes in the cerebrospinal fluid. It is usually considered to be a sign of infection or inflammation within the nervous system, and is encountered in a number of neurological diseases, such as pseudomigraine, Susac's syndrome, and encephalitis. While lymphocytes make up roughly a quarter of all white blood cells in the body, they are generally rare in the CSF. Under normal conditions, there are usually less than 5 white blood

### Pleocytose

Typically, CSF findings include lymphocytic pleocytosis. In many of the infections that cause chronic meningitis, CSF contains only a few of the organisms, making identification of the cause difficult. Thus, diagnosis of subacute or chronic meningitis based on CSF findings may require multiple large samples over time, particularly for cultures.

Cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) typically shows lymphocytic pleocytosis, elevated protein, and low glucose. The most common type of fungal meningitis is caused by Cryptococcus neoformans. A rapid etiologic diagnosis is required to guide antifungal therapy.

The CSF reveals mild (10 to 100 cells/mm 3) lymphocytic pleocytosis, protein in the range of 40 to 250 mg/dl, and a positive VDRL. Parenchymatous neurosyphilis, or general paresis, is syphilitic meningoencephalitis.

Pts with severe headache, temporary neurological deficit and CSF pleocytosis (cells 16-350 wbc, predominantly lymphocytes) and elevated CSF protein that is self limiting. Most have more than one episode and there is often a strong migraine history.

“Pleocytosis” refers to increased CSF NCC beyond reference range (typically >5 NC/μl for CMC and LC CSF). Pleocytosis may be mild (greater than reference value but <25 cells/μl), moderate (26 to 100 cells/μl), or marked (>100 cells/μl).18 Etiologies that result in CSF pleocytosis are varied.

Pleocytosis is the term given to an increased amount of WBCs in a body fluid. CSF normally contains very few WBCs. The type of WBC present in CSF correlates with various forms of inflammation, infection, or malignant condition. WBCs that can be present in CSF include neutrophils, lymphocytes, plasma cells, eosinophils, monocytes, and macrophages.

The necrotizing meningoencephalitis (Pug/Maltese, Yorkshire Terrier encephalitis) usually cause primarily lymphocytic pleocytosis. This type of pleocytosis can be also seen in viral meningitis (rabies, canine distemper) and lymphoma in the CNS.

Subsequent EEGs demonstrate generalized slowing but no epileptiform activity. An infectious workup is negative. Head MRI shows bilateral cerebellar T2/FLAIR increased signal, which is a nonspecific finding. Cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) studies show lymphocytic pleocytosis and oligoclonal bands.

Enteroviruses are the most common cause, usually causing infection during summer or early autumn. CSF findings (usually lymphocytic pleocytosis, near normal glucose, and slightly increased protein) cannot exclude acute bacterial meningitis. Treat patients for acute bacterial meningitis until that diagnosis is ruled out.
