Elk vary more in their presence/absence, as at least one elk bone is found at 69% of sites with low suitability, 46% of sites with medium suitability, and 88% of sites with high suitability. Pronghorn bone is found at only 1/3 of all sites, but the presence is sequentially correlated, with increases from 22% to 52% to 83% at sites with low, medium, and high suitability, respectively.

The Elk Pass quarry is a geochemical parent source of obsidian, the material occurring as nodules within a rhyolite talus slope in an alpine setting near the crest of the Cascades (McClure 1989). Several lithic reduction loci with high densities of surface debitage were identified near the talus source of the material.
